Eighteen members attended the range to compete in the Westlake Vineyard Trophy which was shot at 300 yards and also to shoot on the Club's new electronic targets which operated flawlessly through out the day. The Club Captain was first to shoot and appeared to be slightly apprehensive as his first two sighters proved to be birds, but he accustomed quickly to the new system, but fell foul with another bird before he finished his first round. Conditions were blustery with squally bursts reaching 14 miles p/h but members coped with the conditions to post reasonable scores. The handicap trophy winner for the day was Graham Davies who only used 84% of his handicap. The only other member not to exceed handicap was John Scobie (95%). Other results for off rifle: TR: John Hoerisch 93.05, FS: Barry Kalleske, 113.7, FO: Trevor Otto, 113.3, FTR: Graham Davies, 99.1. Snipers were TR: John Scobie 18.1, FS: Peter Dayman, 23.3, FO: Trevor Otto, 22.1 and F/TR: Graham Davies, 7. It is also worthy to note that members quickly adapted to the new electronic scoring system and showed great interest in how it operated with everyone taking turns at recording and making changes to the program to record results and progressing to the next shooter. Next week's competition is the M Schemmeld Trophy and will be shot over three ranges, 500 yards, 600 yards and 700 yards (each 2 and 7 to count) so please be early to see how the new electronic system is set up and help with the setting of the flags.
